Overview

Support spacing depends on load and installation standards. Then apply the formula:
Support Quantity = Length ÷ Spacing + 1 4. Adjust for Special Conditions
The NEC requires that cable trays must be supported by members at an interval specified by the cable tray manufacturer, but not more than 5 feet for horizontal runs to support the weight of the cables and other loads. The NEC has a requirement for ladder-type cable trays.
