Cut any aramid (Kevlar) strength members flush with scissors. Strip the buffer coating (250 μm or 900 μm) using a dedicated fiber stripper, pulling in a single smooth motion to prevent micro-cracks.

Step 2: Cleaning Clean the exposed fiber with lint-free wipes and high-purity alcohol to remove dust, oils, or residue. Cleanliness is critical, as even microscopic contamination can cause signal loss or reflection.

Step 3: Connector Termination (Mechanical) **Select Connector Type:** Choose SC, LC, ST, FC, or MPO connectors based on application. **Insert Fiber:** Place the stripped fiber into the connector ferrule, ensuring precise alignment of the core inside the ceramic sleeve. **Secure Fiber:** Use epoxy or mechanical crimping to hold the fiber in place. For pre-polished connectors, follow manufacturer instructions for insertion and locking. **Polish Endface:** If required, polish the connector endface to achieve a smooth, flat surface for minimal light loss. **Inspect:** Use a fiber microscope to check for scratches, chips, or misalignment.

Step 4: Fusion Splicing (Permanent) **Align Fibers:** Place the stripped fibers into a fusion splicer, which aligns them automatically. **Fuse Fibers:** The splicer uses an electric arc to melt and join the fiber ends, creating a seamless optical path. **Protect Splice:** Apply a heat-shrink sleeve or protective tube to maintain mechanical strength and prevent environmental damage. **Inspect Splice:** Check the splice quality using the splicer's built-in loss esti...
