A common practice is to use figure-8 loops when laying cable on a surface during installation, which prevents twisting and maintains the fiber's integrity. Loop sizes generally range from 2 to 4 meters, depending on cable stiffness and diameter. Storage and Protection During installation and storage, fiber optic cables must be protected from mechanical stress, moisture, and extreme temperatures. Reels should remain upright and secured to prevent movement, and cable ends should be sealed with heat-shrink caps to prevent moisture intrusion. Avoid placing reels on uneven or sharp surfaces, and do not pull cables over edges or sharp objects. LSZH-sheathed cables are particularly sensitive to cracks, so mechanical pressure should be minimized, especially at crossing points. Cable Reserve Frames For organized slack management, adjustable cable reserve frames are commonly used. These frames, made of galvanized steel, can be installed on poles or inside manholes and allow easy access to stored cable. For example, the SZ-B-4/6 adjustable frame can store up to 80 meters of 10mm cable and is expandable to accommodate different cable capacities. Proper use of these frames ensures that slack is accessible for maintenance or network expansion without compromising ca...
