Domestic Fiber Optic Expansion Iran has been actively modernizing its telecommunications infrastructure, with a major focus on replacing traditional copper networks with fiber optic cables. The Telecommunication Company of Iran (TCI) launched a national fiber optic project aimed at connecting 27 million users and phasing out copper lines within five years, prioritizing provincial capitals and high-density areas to meet growing bandwidth demands . In Markazi Province alone, 224 kilometers of fiber optic cable were deployed in the past year, targeting industrial centers and population hubs . This expansion is supported by domestic manufacturing, creating jobs and boosting local ICT industries . Fiber optics provide faster, more reliable data transmission compared to copper, enabling improved digital connectivity for economic, research, and administrative purposes . Submarine Cable Strategy Iran's strategic location along the Strait of Hormuz makes it a critical node for international fiber optic cables. At least five major submarine cable systems traverse these waters, carrying nearly all intercontinental internet traffic and significant financial transactions . Following recent geopolitical tensions, Iran is asserting sovereign control over these cables, including permit requirements, transit fees, and exclusive maintenance rights, potentially generating hundreds of millions in annual revenue and reshaping global data governance . This move highlights the dual importance of fiber optics for both domestic connectivity and international strategic leverage.
