Existing conduits, basements, attics, or abandoned cable runs can simplify installation. Avoid areas with extreme temperatures, high foot traffic, or sharp edges that could damage the cable. For residential installations, single-mode fiber is standard, often pre-terminated with connectors like SC/APC or LC to simplify connection to the ONT or patch panels. Use soft Velcro ties and flexible low-voltage conduit to protect the cable and maintain signal integrity. Ensure the ONT is near a power source and networking hardware for efficient distribution. Protect fiber runs in high-traffic areas with conduit to prevent accidental damage.
