To secure the cable to a pulley, expose a small portion of the strength member, loop it through a cable pull-eye, and tape or knot it securely. For multi-strand or pre-terminated cables, specialized pulling eyes or socks can be used to distribute tension evenly. Installation Tips Ensure the pulley or roller is rated for the cable's weight and tension. Maintain a minimum bend radius to prevent fiber damage; most aerial fiber cables require at least 12 inches for smooth transitions. Use multiple pulleys or rollers for long spans to reduce friction and stress on the cable. Inspect all hardware for secure attachment to poles or support structures before pulling. Consider using a fiber optic cable puller trailer for long-haul installations, which provides a mobile, self-contained pulling system with capstans and hydraulic power for efficient cable deployment.
