

What does fiber optic cable look like on a router

The outermost layer, or jacket, protects the cable from environmental factors and mechanical stress.

Connectors The ends of the fiber optic cable have specialized connectors that plug into the router or ONT. Common types include:

- SC (Subscriber Connector):** Push-pull design, durable, often used in telecom and datacom applications.
- LC (Lucent Connector):** Smaller, high-density connector commonly used in modern routers and data centers.
- ST (Straight Tip) and MTP/MPO:** Less common, used for multi-fiber connections in high-density setups.

For home routers, the fiber cable is usually plugged into an ONT, which then connects to the router via Ethernet. The fiber end may have a small plastic tip, and in some cases, a faint light can be seen when the cable is active, though direct viewing of the light should be avoided to prevent eye...
