- OFN cables can occupy the same tray with Class 1 power, ITC, or medium-power network cables operating at 1000 volts or less.
- OFC cables must be separated from other cables to prevent electrical interference or hazards.
- Cable tray fill capacities for optical fiber cables are not explicitly defined in NEC; designers should follow manufacturer guidance.
